RULES AND INFORMATION: The USGA Rules of Golf, the MGA Rules Card, and all Local Rules established specifically for the Championship will be in effect. Players wanting the MGA Terms of Competition may find it on the MGA web site – www.mngolf.org - under the Tournament & Rules Section. Local Rules will be distributed daily to the players at their respective starting holes.

PRACTICE ROUNDS: Detroit CC- Pine to Palm is a public facility with practice rounds available by tee time arrangement in advance. Please call Detroit CC Golf Shop at (218) 847-5970 to schedule a practice round and identify yourself as a Minnesota State Junior Boys participant. Sunday Practice round rates are \$36 for 18 holes walking after 12 pm. Adults may play with the junior at adult rates found on the [Detroit Country Club website](#).

DISTANCE MEASURING DEVICES: Players are permitted to use distance measuring devices.

PACE OF PLAY: The official MGA Pace of Play Policy will be in effect and is posted on our website.

PLAYER CONDUCT: The Rules Officials will strongly enforce a code of conduct for all players. Unbecoming conduct includes, but is not limited to the following:

- (1) Any use of loud profanity reported and collaborated will be penalized.
- (2) Any club throwing, club slamming or other disruptive behavior will be penalized.

Penalty for unbecoming conduct – **two strokes**;

Penalty for repeated offense or a serious breach of player conduct - **disqualification**.

PRACTICE RANGE: The practice range will open one hour prior to the first starting time both days. Range balls are provided prior to your round. Each player must go into the pro shop and grab a token. Course personnel will have a list of players keeping track of who has grabbed a token.

PLAYER MEALS: The MGA will provide each competitor with a meal at the club both Monday and Tuesday. **Monday and Tuesday** meal service will be available from 11:00am through 5:00pm either before or after your round. Course personnel will have a list of players based on their starting times as a way of keeping track of the meals handed out.

DRESS CODE: **The dress code will be strictly enforced.** For all MGA competitions, players must be neat in appearance with respect to personal grooming and clothing. All players are required to wear shirts with collars and sleeves, and either golf slacks or Bermuda shorts, which measure no higher than 2 inches above their knees. Examples of attire NOT ACCEPTABLE attire includes the following: short shorts, athletic shorts, tennis shorts, cut-offs, jeans, jean shorts, tank tops, t-shirts, sweat pants. The committee in charge shall decide whether this requirement has been met and will withdraw the entry of the player who does not comply.

DIGITAL SCORING: Scoring will be done by use of the USGA Tournament Management app. Players should have the app downloaded on their phones and be prepared to keep score for the group. The group GGID will be sent via text to all players the night before each round.

BUNKERS: There will be **NO** bunker rakes out on the course, so per the USGA we will be using their Covid-19 local rule for bunkers. The [COVID-19 Special Local Rule](#) for a ball coming to rest in any unrepaired damage within a bunker is in effect. In addition to playing the ball as it lies, the player may elect to take (free) relief from any unrepaired damage within a bunker should the damage interfere with the player's lie of ball or area of intended swing. The player must identify the nearest point of relief (a) **IN THE BUNKER** and (b) **NO CLOSER TO THE HOLE** and **DROP A BALL** within one club-length of that spot, no closer to the hole. In the unlikely event there is no place in the bunker within one club-length that the

player may drop a ball without going closer to the hole, the player may drop at the *nearest point of relief* even if closer to the hole. The player also has the option to drop behind the bunker using "back on the line relief" for a one (1) stroke penalty.

CADDIES AND CARTS: Players may walk carrying their own clubs or use a pull cart. Also, players are prohibited from the use of a caddie; due to our policy regarding Covid-19 safety guidelines. Spectator Carts will not be allowed without a handicap placard. See an MGA Rules official on site for permission to rent a riding cart.

AWARDS PRESENTATION: Immediately after the conclusion of the play Wednesday, there will be an awards presentation. Awards will be given to the top 3 players. Ties for 2nd and 3rd will be decided using a scorecard playoff per USGA guidelines.

ETIQUETTE: Please be courteous to your fellow-competitors and the golf course by replacing divots and fixing ball marks.
